Undescended testis


Myths
It will come down by age 6
Misconceptions
Ultrasound is necessary
Mistakes
The scrotum looks full
Not examining male genitalia



You have been following a 6 year old boy since birth. Several past notes read "Normal genitalia". On today's exam neither testis is in the scrotum but you can feel both in the groin. What do you do?

- 1. Plan to check again on your next physical exam
- 2. Order an ultrasound exam
- 3. Instruct parents to massage the groin to bring them back down
- 4. Reassure parents that they will eventually come down
- 5. Refer to Urology





Evolution of preputial retractibility




Initially fused


10⁵ colonies is always an infection in a clean catch specimen

Causes of PYURIA









Why does it matter?

Overdiagnosis of urinary tract infection leads to Unnecessary antibiotics Unnecessary studies Ultrasound

VCUG

Unnecessary surgery in patient with known urinary tract abnormality



Antenatal Hydronephrosis

Misconceptions

Vesicoureteral reflux is benign and therefore does not need to be pursued

Mistakes

Not following up a maternal history of antenatal hydronephrosis
